

#### El Museo del Barrio

The museum also hosts educational programs and community events to celebrate and promote Latino culture and heritage.

Activities include workshops on cart repair, cooking demonstrations, and enjoying murals on movable furniture. There will be reading areas for children, vendors selling food, crafts, and art.
