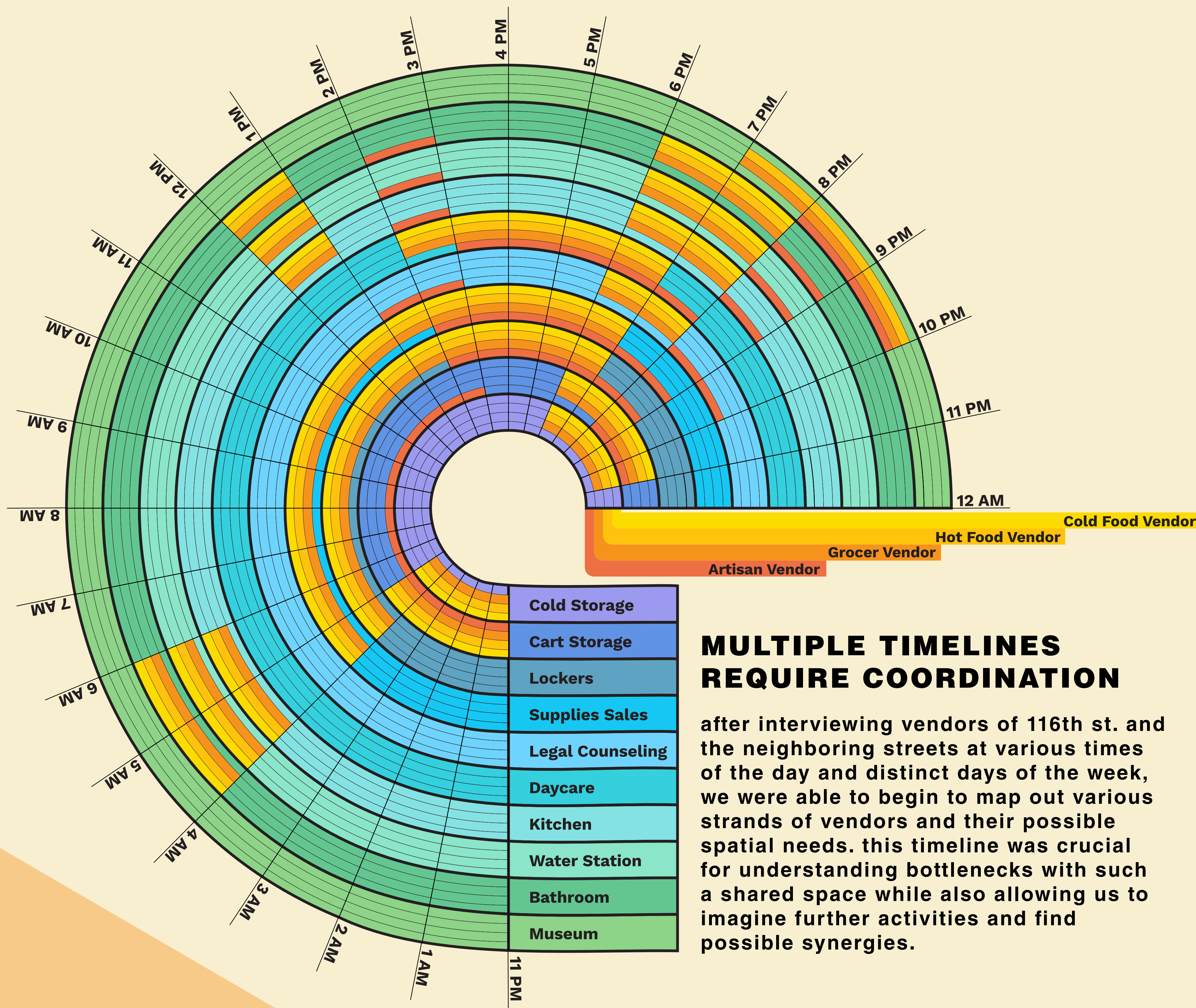

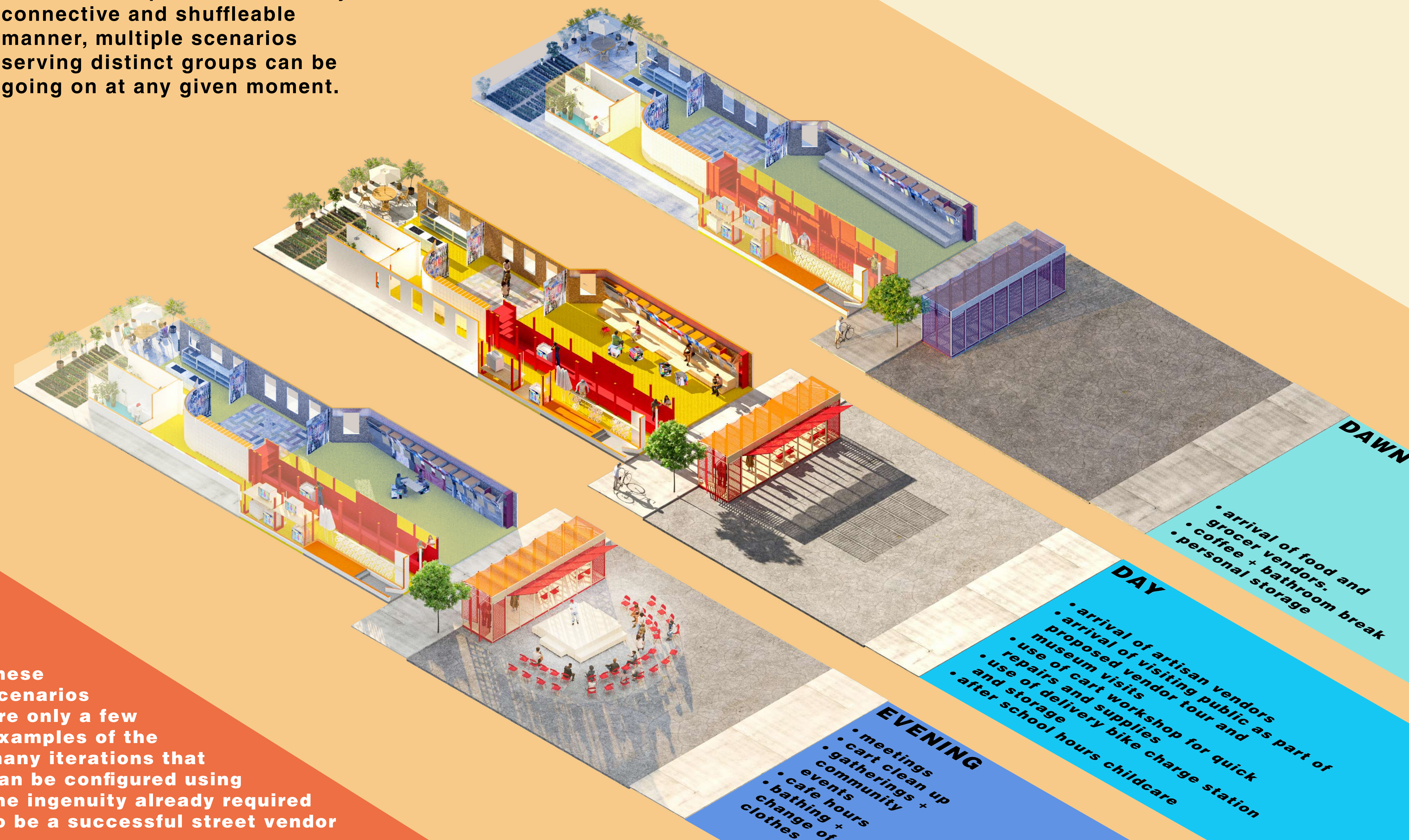


## MULTIPLE TIMELINES REQUIRE COORDINATION
